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State Champs to Battle in adidas Boys', Girls' Dream 100s

Katia Seymour, #1 in U.S., Leads the Fields for adidas Boost Boston Games

BOSTON, Mass. (June 16, 2016)—The fastest high school 100-meter girl in the nation for 2016 headlines a pair of fields loaded with state sprint champions for the **adidas Boys' Dream Mile** and **adidas Girls' Dream Mile** at the **adidas Boost Boston Games** on Saturday, organizers have announced.

Katia Seymour (Palatka, FL) will bring the #1 time in the U.S. of 11.26 seconds to Charles Street in Boston on Saturday as she and **Anthony Schwartz** (Plantation, FL) lead the Dream Mile fields, which will compete in the first-ever street meet in the U.S. Tickets and information are available at www.adidasBoostBoston.com.

Since the Dream 100s began, its athletes have included **Marvin Bracy**, who went on to become the 2014 IAAF World Indoor silver medalist at 60 meters, and **Octavious Freeman**, the 2013 IAAF World Championships silver medalist in the 4x100 relay—both of whom are expected to compete here Saturday as professionals. In addition, **Trayvon Bromell**, who won a 100-meter bronze medal at last year's IAAF World Championships, and **Candace Hill**, the 2015 World Youth Champion at both 100 and 200 meters who recently made her pro debut, are also among the Dream 100 athletes who have gone on to post-prep success.

Joining Seymour, the 2016 Florida 2A champion at both 100 and 200 meters, in the **adidas Girls' Dream 100** are:

Amuru Patterson (Haines City, FL), 2016 state 4A and Flo Golden South champion at 100 and 200 meters;

Tamari Davis (Gainesville, FL), the top middle-school runner in the U.S. at both 100 and 200 meters who is competing here as a seventh-grader; and

Abby Steiner (Dublin Coffman/Dublin OH), 2016 state champion at 100 and 200 meters and two-time state indoor champion at 60 meters; and

Ariyonna Augustine (Long Beach Poly, Long Beach CA), the 2015 national indoor freshman champion at 60m.

The **adidas Boys' Dream 100** will feature:



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Anthony Schwartz (American Heritage HS/Plantation, FL), 2016 state champion at 100 and 200 meters as a sophomore, ranked #5 in the U.S. (10.37);

Cravont Charleston (Mallard Creek HS/Charlotte NC), 2016 state champion at 100 meters, #6 in the U.S.;

Eric Stokes (Eastside HS/Covington GA), 2016 state champion at 100 and 200 meters, 2015 state champion at 400 meters; #7 in the U.S.;

Micah Beaver (Raymore-Peculiar HS/Peculiar MO), 2016 state champion at 100 meters, 2015 state champion at 200 meters, two-time Kansas Relays Champion at 100 meters; and

Ramone Newland (South Shore HS/Brooklyn NY), runner-up in the 2016 state championships at 100 meters.

The Dream sprinters will be showcased along with two-time Olympic silver medalist **Yohan Blake** of Jamaica and 2012 Olympic gold medalist **Jenn Suhr** in the pole vault, among many other top names.

The **adidas Boost Boston Games** is produced by Boston-based Global Athletics and Marketing, Inc., an athlete-management and sports marketing firm that from 2005 to 2015 served as organizer of the adidas Grand Prix in NYC and since 1996 has given Boston fans an annual, world-class indoor meet at the Reggie Lewis Track and Athletic Center at Roxbury Community College.
